Ms C Harbrow Headteacher We have had several complaints about inconsiderate and sometimes illegal parking around school since the beginning of term.

I am sure that you are as concerned as I am about ensuring the safety of our children –especially during those times when they are coming into and leaving from school.

Please be aware that the following is from the Highway Code, which is legally enforceable.

Rule 240

You MUST NOT stop or park on:

- a pedestrian crossing, including the area marked by the zig-zag lines (see Rule 191)
- a clearway (see <u>Traffic signs</u>)
- a road marked with double white lines, even when a broken white line is on your side of the road, except to pick up or set down passengers, or to load or unload goods

Rule 242

You **MUST NOT** leave your vehicle or trailer in a dangerous position or where it causes any unnecessary obstruction of the road.

Laws RTA 1988 sect 22 & CUR reg 103

Rule 243

DO NOT stop or park:

- near a school entrance
- anywhere you would prevent access for Emergency Services
- on the approach to a level crossing/tramway crossing
- opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space
- opposite a traffic island or (if this would cause an obstruction) another parked vehicle
- where the kerb has been lowered to help wheelchair users and powered mobility vehicles
- in front of an entrance to a property
- on a bend
- where you would obstruct cyclists' use of cycle facilities

except when forced to do so by stationary traffic.

Let us all work together to keep our children safe from harm.

Please park safely and with consideration
