Whole School Food Policy.

We have now implemented our new whole school food policy and would like to thank all the parents who have supported us doing so. The finalised policy is now on the website along with ideas for healthy packed lunches. Please look in the Key Information section of the site to find the policy and the assembly that was delivered to the children, along with other links you may find helpful.

The key points to be aware of are:

- 1. Break time snacks fruit (fresh or dried) and vegetables ONLY will be allowed as snacks.
- 2. WATER ONLY is allowed in water bottles for drinking during the day or at lunchtimes.
- Birthday treats are still allowed but we ask parents and carers to seriously consider sending healthy alternatives to sweets.

Packed lunches:

Packed lunch children will be able to have a drink of water in the dining hall so an additional drink is not necessary.

- 1. Packed lunches should be in line with the Eatwell guide (see on the website) and should include at least one piece of fruit and/or vegetables.
- Unhealthy snacks such as crisps are strongly discouraged and sweets are not allowed in lunch boxes.
- Children are allowed a SMALL treat (e.g. chocolate biscuit) in their lunch box. We suggest treats should not exceed 100 calories in line with current government guidelines.
