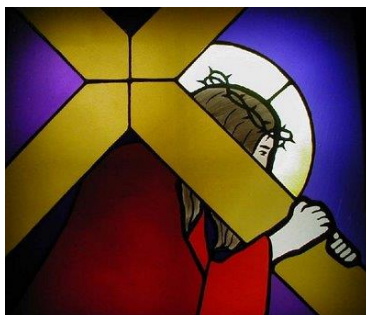

This ancient and beautiful act of worship follows Jesus on his journey to Calvary on the first Good Friday, using 14 pictures, or stations to recall the events of the day. The service, which lasts for about 40 minutes, is led by members of the congregation and school staff. There is plenty of audience participation, familiar songs and after worship we have refreshments and hot cross buns. The children are given a memento of the occasion to take home.

Easter Experience

EXPERIENCE EASTER is an activity to help children know the events of Holy Week and Easter Day and help them to see the relevance of the story in their own lives.

Once again this year a team from the congregation of Holy Trinity Church along with school staff are delighted to be able to offer Experience Easter to children in Y2 and Y6.

The order is given to you and the children will be well prepared, so there's no explaining or teaching for you to do. Most of the volunteers like to join in the activities, but there's no obligation to do so. The session ends with refreshments and some social time together. Having help from our volunteers is really important in ensuring the smooth running of each session. We can't do it without you, so 'Thank You' in advance!
