Year 5/6 spelling words

Don't forget to be revising the Year5/6 words we sent home at the beginning of half term. You should be able to spell most of them correctly and be using in your writing to show Year 6 standard of spelling. They are the types of word that may be in the SATs spelling test. Over the next 2 weeks, continue to revise the words, perhaps by getting someone at home to test you, and highlight/tick them as you can spell them. Bring your list back in 2 weeks – the Friday before SATs – so we can see how you have been getting on.
