## **Cashless Office**

We are working towards no longer accepting cash and cheque payments in school from September 2019, making the school a cash-free environment.

Many parents already use our Parentmail App to pay for such items as school meals; trips; afterschool sporting clubs and our own Before & After School Club.

We are hoping to start selling uniform via the App at the start of the next term – you will need to order and pay for items online and then collect them from the office.

### **Making secure payments online using your credit, debit card or PayPal**

Parentmail offers you the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever you like, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week - safe in the knowledge that the technology used is of the highest internet security available. You will have a secure online account, activated using a unique username and password; you will be prompted to change these, and to keep them safe and secure. If you have more than one child at our school, you can merge their accounts to create one login for all your children. Making a payment is straightforward and Parentmail holds a payment history for you to view; no card details are stored in any part of the system. Once you've activated your account you can make online payments straight away.
