Second hand uniform sale at parents evening

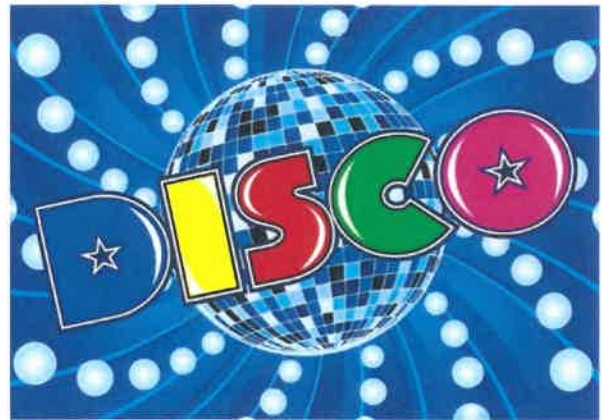
The uniform sales at parents' evenings raised over £90. Thank you to everyone who donated and purchased items.

HOWEVER these will be the only stalls we can run unless we receive volunteers to help with the planning for other stalls. We need help to purchase the prizes (e.g. small trinkets and toys from the likes of Baker Ross) for the following:

We also need volunteers to help us set up for the fayre (any time from 2:30 - 5pm), to help run the stalls on the night and help clear away (7 - 8pm).

Please let us know what you might be able to do to help. Lots of the jobs can be done at home , so you do not need to do in school or attend the PTA meetings.

Anyone who takes on one of the above will get a free drink at the fayre.

The next PTA meeting will be held on **Wednesday 20th November at 6pm** at school. We will be focussing on organising the Christmas fayre so please come along and share your ideas and suggestions. Everyone is welcome.
