A continued way of working - week 8

It was fantastic to see the children come back after half term this week.

As you probably know that some bubbles had to close during the last week of term-including into the first weekend of the half term break.

When there is a notification of COVID-19 in school we always notify the DfE, PHE and the Local Authority. They advise what has to be done and then we follow those instructions. We then notify those parents of children involved in any bubble having to stay at home with instructions about what has to happen. We also inform the rest of the school community that there has been a case. We will not divulge who has caught COVID-19 or how many people have developed the virus - that is a matter of medical privacy.

If your child has to isolate due to their bubble collapsing then they must remain in the house/garden. Your child is not allowed out of the house or garden for the duration of 14 days and is not allowed to mix with anyone else outside of the household. It is a legal obligation for you to keep your child within those parameters. It is a matter of law that this happens.

Thankyou also for remembering not to come to your allotted gate before the 5minutes when your child's entry time is. We have only 3 gates onto the school site and 14 classes to get through these gates. Arriving too early (or too late) means that there will be a crossover of bubbles with the added problem of pavements being more crowded than they need to be. It is really important that once you have dropped your child at the correct gate you make sure to move away from it as soon as you can so that the pavements are kept as clear as possible. I have included the gate times again to remind you of them. Everyone who drops off their child at the school gates or picks up from - or visits the school office must wear a face covering unless they have a medical reason not to. In this time of pandemic it is important to look after each other so we prevent the spread of this virus amongst our school and Cookridge community; we can do this by ensuring a face covering is worn.

Leeds is in a very precarious situation in terms of rising number of COVID cases and I am sure you are with me in wishing that we see no more cases at Holy Trinity. Please work with us in achieving this.

I know that during this worrying time there needs to be a little light at the end of the tunnel. I have heard that some parents are wondering if Christmas will actually happen at Holy Trinity this year. Well - worry no longer! Christmas may look a little different from our usual celebrations - BUT we have been on the Christmas case since before October half term and we have a selection of magical somethings that will happen.

Seth Clark from 5E would like to ask for your support.


