

This week, we have been looking at Roman villas in our English lessons.

One of the features of a Roman house or villa is mosaic floors.

Mosaic floors have been found on the floors of many Roman buildings. Mosaic floors were a statement of wealth and importance. Rich Romans decorated the floors of their main rooms with **mosaics** – tiny coloured stones (tesserae). These were stuck to the floor with mortar, a type of cement. Each mosaic used thousands of pieces to make a patter.


Different patterns can be made by using different lines and shapes. You can repeat the line or shape to create a repeating pattern or you can use different combinations to create your design.

Today we are going to create our own Roman villa mosaic tile.






