In the case of a COVID-19 notification over the Christmas holidays

If your child tests positive for COVID-19 Saturday 19th December to Thursday 24th December you will need to notify school via the info@holytrinity.leeds.sch.uk email address. We will be monitoring this email daily (at 10am) as we are required to report any cases of COVID to Public Health England.

If there is positive test result reported to us on Saturday or Sunday (19th and 20th December) of someone in your child's class, we will notify you of it and your child will need to isolate for the 10days from the last contact with the person who has contracted the virus. (10 days as opposed to 14 days as per new Government guidance 14 Dec 2020). This information will be sent to you via email. If your child has to isolate that means that they will not be able to leave your house/garden for that period of time.

As always thank you for your continued support during these difficult times.

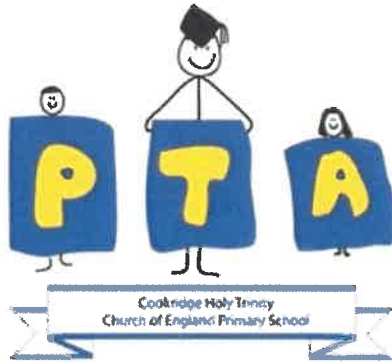
