


L.O. To know and use geographical vocabulary.

mountain

A large, steeply raised area of land, higher than a hill.

hill

A raised area of land, not as high as a mountain.

valley

A low area of land between two hills or mountains. Usually with a river of stream flowing through it.







lake

A area of water with land around it.

river

A large natural stream of flowing water.

forest

A large area covered mostly with trees.







city
A place where lots of people live and work. It is larger than a town and usually has a cathedral.

town

A place where people live and work. Smaller than a city but larger than a village.

village

A small number of houses often with a church and a small shop. Usually in a rural area.







hamlet

A very small group of houses, smaller than a village.

farm

A place where crops are grown or animals are reared.


bridge

A structure carrying a road, path or railway over an obstacle e.g. a river.









A large natural stream of flowing water.

A large area covered mostly with trees.

A low area of land between two hills or mountains. Usually with a river or stream flowing through it.

A raised area of land, not as high as a mountain.
