


Introduction

The natural environments of the world (including Australian natural environments) are being damaged and, in some cases destroyed, by human activities. Each natural environment is unique.

Biomes

A biome is a large geographical area of certain plant and animal groups, which have adapted to that particular environment. The desert biome, for example, is made up of all the deserts on Earth. The climate and geography of a region determines what type of biome can exist in that region. The major biomes on the planet are deserts, forests, grasslands, tundra and water or aquatic environments. Each biome consists of many ecosystems whose communities have adapted to the small differences in climate and the environment inside the biome.
