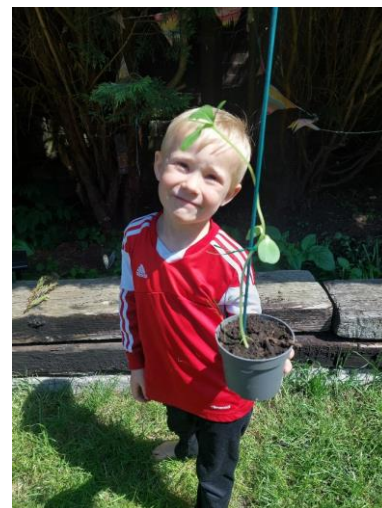
### **Home School Values**
