School uniform including PE uniform

There appears to be a slip in children wearing the correct school uniform to PE recently.

Please see the uniform list that should be worn:

Gold T-shirt this can be worn with or without the Holy Trinity logo
Navy shorts for both boys and girls
Short white socks and pumps or trainers for games
Bare feet for gymnastics and dance
Navy tracksuit and school fleece/hooded top if preferred for outdoors
Please note that there should be no logos on any of the PE kit – apart from school logos.

No jewellery should be worn except a wristwatch. Children with long hair need to have their hair tied back. Pierced ears –A small simple plain stud can be worn in school. Your child will remove earrings that do not comply. The school takes no responsibility for lost earrings.

Earrings should be removed and left at home on PE days. If your child has had recently pierced ears then plasters must be supplied from home for the first eight weeks when doing PE. After that it is expected they will be removed for PE.


