

English

This half term, children will investigate Ancient Greek Myths and Legends. They will look at a number of different stories, analysing the key features before writing their own myth or legend. Linked to History lessons, children will undertake research on Ancient Greece and produce their own non-chronological report about this period of history. Children will continue to develop their spelling, punctuation and grammar skills as well as undertaking regular reading skill activities.

Science- Animals including humans

In science, children will examine different animals and the nutrition they need in order to survive. We will also look at the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates and how we can classify animals. Children will also look at the human skeleton and learn how muscles help us move.

Maths

Children will continue to develop their understanding of fractions, they will learn how to find fractions of numbers, order fractions as well as being able to add and subtract unit and non-unit fractions with the same denominator. Following this, children will further their understanding of time and money while developing their ability to solve practical

History

RE

Our school value this half term is Peace.

In R.E. lessons, children will learn about the core beliefs of the Hindu faith and learn about the different Gods Hindus worship. They will also learn about how Hindus worship in a Mandir and at home.

Physical Education

In Real PE sessions, children will continue to develop coordination and body movement to an increasing complexity.

In outdoor P.E sessions, children will be learning how to play cricket and practising skills such as batting, bowling, throwing and catching.

Art Children will continue to use and keep a sketchbook to record their observations and use them to explore their ideas. Linked to our topic of Ancient Greece children will design and create their own Greek-style vase.

Children will consolidate prior learning in French, as well as looking at the names of different Olympic sports in French.

Computing

Children will continue to develop their understanding of coding. Using scratch, children will create their own code to control a sprite getting it to respond and react to their prompts.

Music

Children will continue working with Glockenspiels to learn how to play basic pitch songs based on two notes, recognising and playing high and low pitch.

PSHE

PSHE lessons will focus on healthy eating and how important it is to maintaining a healthy lifestyle. We will also look at how branding impacts our food choices.
