#### Homework

Maths - 15 minutes Numbots per week. 3x5 minutes is better than one chunk of 15 minutes to aid memory and fluency. We will keep track that the 15 minutes has been completed each week.

Reading - Two reading books will be sent home on a Monday. These should be read and returned by the following Monday, with comments from an adult written in the Reading Record books. The more detailed the comments, the better. These comments will be checked by TAs before new books are given out.



### Spellings

- Spelling sheets will go home on Friday to be tested the following Friday. There will be spare sheets in school if your child loses theirs. Please let us know as soon as possible if you require a new spelling sheet.
- Children will bring their spelling books home on Friday for you to see how they got on.
   Please return the books on Monday.
- Children will also be tested on the Y2 common exception words three times throughout the year (64 words). You are not expected to practise these specifically as they will be included as part of the 10 spellings tested each week.



### Start and end of the day

- $\bullet$  The first day back at school will be Tuesday  $2^{\rm nd}$  September.
- The children will line up next to the ramp when the bell rings. We will be outside to greet the children and take them into class.
- At 3.25pm we will take our classes outside and wait at the bottom of the ramp. The children will be allowed to go once they put their hand up and let us know they've seen their adult.



### Things to note

• P.E. will be taught on Monday (outside) and Wednesdays (inside) Please make sure your child has the correct named uniform with black or white trainers - no logos.



- Please can children bring a <u>named water bottle</u> to school everyday. It should have a <u>sports cap</u> to reduce spillages.
- Children need to bring a book bag into school and not a rucksack. This is so that they fit into trays easily. Please can we ask that they don't attach accessories to the book bags as we struggle then to fit them into trays!
- Please can children also bring into school a carrier bag with pumps and a change of clothes in which can be kept on their peg all year, in case of playground accidents!



Please be vigilant with social media and check which Apps your children are using. We would advise against group chats and posting photographs.

They should not be using Facebook, Instagram or WhatsApp at 6 and 7 years of age.

We promote E-safety at school and would appreciate your support with this at home.





# How can you help your child over the summer?

- Handwriting neat, on the line, with tall and hanging letters (Holiday diary?). Ensure they're starting and finishing letters in the correct place or they'll struggle to learn to join their letters in Year 2.
- Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s & number bonds within 10, to 20 and to 100.
- Reading literally anything! They need to continue to read to you and please try to read stories to them to build their vocabulary.



# How can you help your child over the summer?

- Shoe laces if you are sending your child in shoes with laces, please teach them to tie them. If they struggle to do their own please send them in velcro shoes and trainers.
- We have noticed that a large number of children aren't using a knife and fork in the dinner hall so please practice this over the summer also.
